

If you grow it, show it.

Tips for exhibitors from Mary Payne M.B.E.

Read the schedule carefully.

Give yourself enough time to stage your exhibits and check you have entered the correct number of specimens in each class. Our judges are very lenient and have been known to eat a pea pod or raspberry if too many were exhibited!

Make your exhibit look as attractive as possible to catch the judges eye. Paper plates are very acceptable.

Take spares along in case of last-minute disasters.

Try to select specimens without blemishes. It is quite OK to pull off the odd blemished petal, but not too many!

When more than one flower / fruit or vegetable is asked for in an exhibit try to select for uniformity.

Potatoes should be washed but avoid scrubbing which can damage the skin. Don't over peel onions / shallots.

Tomatoes should be ripe, but firm and with the calyx attached.

Raspberries should have the stalks attached.

Do not be put off when staging your exhibit by the arrival of someone with larger potatoes or beans than you – the biggest is not always best!! Jams, jellies, chutneys and pickles must be in glass jars, please check the lid is not too tight to make it easy for the judges

The more folk who enter, the better the spectacle for all who visit the show, and it is the taking part that is so important in a community project.

Arts and crafts classes

Summer is now supposed to be here, and the next Flower Show is nearly upon us. The number of arts and crafts that has entered never ceases to amaze me.

For such a small village, there is certainly a lot of creativity happening. If you like to paint and draw, then your artwork will be very welcome. We usually have a lot of entries, and

always try to make a good display. Maybe your creativity lies with a different medium, be it textile, paper, clay, wood,

metal, or re-purposed scraps. There is sure to be a category you can enter.

Don't be shy, we're not looking for experts. Sometimes a piece may not be perfect, but it will display the love and enthusiasm that went into its creation. Often, this is what the judges will pick up on.

Remember, the winning is not really important, it's all about the fun and the sharing.

Guidance for photography exhibitors

The photography section is always interesting and now that we all carry camera in our phones, photo opportunities are always ready to be enjoyed.

Photos can be displayed with a card frame or border if desired, but nothing too big (max A4), or heavy that may make them difficult to display on the day.

Images must have been taken in the last 5 years and by the exhibitor.

Maximum of 3 entries per class, per person. Do not enter previously entered photos. Your honesty is presumed.

Participants can be as creative as they like with the subject. Displays should be in 2D.

Black and white photos are also very welcome.

Additional information about the entry, or any unusual camera settings are welcome as they can increase interest.

Top tips for Class 52 - How to grow a cress egg head's hair.



Soft boil an egg and cut off the top and enjoy with "toast soldiers"! Discard the top piece of shell. Carefully wash the shell and when dry use your imagination to decorate the shell with a face or whatever you fancy using pencils, crayon, coloured stickers, or paint etc. This can be done later, once you see what the egg head's "hair" looks like. Roughly half fill the shell with some damp soil or potting compost. A moistened cotton wool ball works very well.

Sprinkle a generous layer of seeds -cress, mustard,



grass seed or whatever you like onto the moist compost / cotton wool . Stand in an egg cup on a windowsill in plenty of light. Keep it moist and watch your egg head's hair grow.



After as little as 24 hours you will see that the seeds (cress) have germinated, and tiny white roots are visible. A day later and tiny green seed leaves have merged. Cress and mustard will take about 7 -10 days, grass seed will take longer.

Do a trail run to get the timing right for the show on Saturday 31 August.

Present your decorated egg head in an egg cup of your choice on flower show day. After the show hard boil another egg and use your cress or mustard to make a sandwich (other seeds may not be edible!)

DEFINED RECIPE FOR CLASS 48

Cheese Scones

Ingredients:

225g (80z) self-raising flour 1 level teaspoon dry mustard Half a level teaspoon salt 55g (20z) grated Cheddar cheese 55g (20z) butter or margarine 125 ml (quarter of a pint) milk

Method:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 190 degrees C.
- 2. Place the sieved flour, salt and mustard into a bowl and add the fat cut into small pieces. Rub in until the mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs.
- 3. Add the grated cheese and milk and stir until a smooth dough is formed. Roll out the dough on a lightly floured board until about 1cm (half inch) thick.
- 4. Cut into rounds, place on a greased baking tray and brush the tops with a little milk.
- 5. Bake for 10-15 minutes, until the scones are well risen, golden brown and firm to touch.



















What to do on the day of the show.

If you plan to exhibit, here's the procedure.

Complete one of the entry forms printed in the middle of the programme, ideally before you arrive, following the instructions given. Please use one form per person.

If you need more, either photocopy the form or print it out from the website **www.stantondrew.org** where a special link has been added.

Please print your name clearly on the form in the way you would like it to appear on any certificates that you may win.

You can enter exhibits in as many of the classes as you like, limited to three entries per class. You can only win one certificate per class.

Please make yourself aware of the class number associated with each of your exhibits. You will have to write that number on your display ticket later.

All exhibits should be brought to the **main flower marquee** in the village hall paddock on Saturday **from 8:00 am**. At registration you will be given one display ticket for each of your exhibits. The ticket will have your name and exhibitor number on it..

You will then be asked to move onto the stewards tables where you will be assisted, if necessary, to write the class number of the exhibit on the ticket. Your name will be folded under to be hidden until after judging. You will then be told where your entries have to be displayed. It is your responsibility to place them in the correct place, but do ask a steward if you need any assistance.

Please be in time to get all your exhibits in place by 10:30am so that judging can begin promptly. Please then leave until the show opens.

.At 1:30pm the Flower Show opens, judging should be complete and class winners certificates displayed. The category winner's prize presentation and the final Best in Show Cup presentation will take place at around 3:45pm. After that has finished at around 4.30pm you may remove your exhibits. The show closes at 4:30pm and from 5pm any remaining exhibits will be disposed of, or eaten! Have a wonderful day and Good Luck.

Stanton Drew Flower Show 2024 Rules and conditions Booking in of entries will take place between 8 am and 10:30 am on the morning of the show. Please bring your entries with a completed booking form to the main marquee in the Village Hall paddock.

- 1. All flowers, vegetables and fruit in the Plant Categories must have been grown by the exhibitor, failure to comply will result in disqualification
- 2. All stands, vases and dishes to be provided by the exhibitor. Water will be available.
- 3. An exhibitor may make up to **three entries per class,** but may only take one prize per class.
- 4. For Arts and Crafts and Photography classes an exhibit may not re-entered within 5 years.
- 5. The Committee will take ordinary care of exhibits, but will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur.
- 6. The decision of the Judges shall be final. There is no 'Appeal' process.
- 7. Certificates will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd in all classes.
- 8. Points for the winning of cups are allocated as follows:- 1st 3pts, 2nd 2pts, and 3rd 1pt for each class. Only one entry per class will be included in the aggregate score.
- 1. There are a number of cups to be won for the various categories and these remain the property of the Show to be returned to the Committee by 31st July 2025, or one month before the next show, whichever is the sooner.
- 2. All exhibits must be left for display between 1:30 pm and 4:00 pm on Saturday 31st August and must be collected by 5.00pm that day after which time they will be disposed of.
- 1. Exhibitors are requested to name the varieties of plants, and materials / methods used in crafts where possible, in order to increase the general interest of the show.
- 2. There is no entry fee for exhibits.
- 3. You need not have grown the exhibits used in classes 55, 58, 62, 63
- 4. Children may enter any of the adult classes, on an equal footing

The placing of exhibits is regarded as acceptance of these rules.

Booking in of entries will take place between 8 am and 10:30 am on the morning of the show. Please bring your entries with a completed booking form to the main marquee in the Village Hall paddock.

- 1. All flowers, vegetables and fruit in the Plant Categories must have been grown by the exhibitor, failure to comply will result in disqualification
- 2. All stands, vases and dishes to be provided by the exhibitor. Water will be available.
- 3. An exhibitor may make up to three entries per class, but may only take one prize per class.
- 4. For Arts and Crafts and Photography classes an exhibit may not re-entered within 5 years.
- 5. The Committee will take ordinary care of exhibits, but will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur.
- 6. The decision of the Judges shall be final. There is no 'Appeal' process.
- 7. Certificates will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd in all classes.
- 8. Points for the winning of cups are allocated as follows:- 1st 3pts, 2nd 2pts, and 3rd 1pt for each class. Only one entry per class will be included n the aggregate score.
- 9. There are a number of cups to be won for the various categories and these remain the property of the Show to be returned to the Committee by 31st July 2025, or one month before the next show, whichever is the sooner.
- 10. All exhibits must be left for display between 1:30 pm and 4:00 pm on Saturday 31st August and must be collected by 5.00pm that day after which time they will be disposed of.
- 11. Exhibitors are requested to name the varieties of plants, and materials / methods used in crafts where possible, in order to increase the general interest of the show.
- 12. There is no entry fee for exhibits.
- 13. You need not have grown the exhibits used in classes 55, 58, 62, 63
- 14. Children may enter any of the adult classes, on an equal footing

The placing of exhibits is regarded as acceptance of these rules.
